7.	<ul> <li>Young Carers Rep:</li> <li>Overviewed very successful previous trip (funded by ceilidh) and asked that this be considered again with upcoming Ceilidh fundraiser (17/11/17)</li> <li>Period of Home Economics: learning to cook inexpensive meals / recipe book / prepare food inexpensively / how to feed themselves without resorting to takeaways or packet meals.</li> <li>All about the social interaction, not focussed on caring responsibilities</li> <li>Work with Stirling Carers service: do 1:1 work with young people / organise trips / overwhelmed with the number of people on the waiting list</li> <li>Provides a stop-gap just now. Ability to inform if someone needs to be 'fast tracked' from the waiting list (waitlist is currently about 50 in number)</li> <li>Looking for funding for cooking resources and possible trips to bond the young carers (pupils) as a team.</li> <li>Some examples of what is done with the young carers: provide food related experience (e.g. take them to a Pizza styled restaurant for pizza making session and social experience) Gill Newell to come along to Ceilidh to do a mini presentation/overview.</li> <li>Approximately 18 young people currently being supported within the school.</li> <li>Can be identified by self, referred by Barnardos, Carers Fair, various means by which young people are referred.</li> <li>Can be isolating, the group provides valued social interaction and identification</li> </ul>
