Includes access to: FV College 'Green Routes', RNIB Centre (Bishopbriggs), Riverbank Centre (Stirling), Camphill (Blair Drummond), Capability Scotland (Perth), and ongoing support from Ochil House facility for the young people with severe/complex needs. 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| 6. | PTN Summary YTD Activities Report: Uniform 'swap-shop': In course of being established. More details will be communicated (eg: donation guidelines, where, and when) Department Funding: (£450) made available to Faculties to boost departmental resources. Feedback: Online parent/carer survey launched, to help find out what the PTN can do better, and what parents hope that the PTN will achieve. Activities Day: supplied treats to 50 pupils who remained within school – providing a 'cinema' styled experience, enhanced by popcorn, juice, ice-creams and chocolate bars supplied by PTN. PTN Constitution: re-written to reflect the current team, including new roles (Ochil House rep, and Pupil representation – Head Boy and Girl) Annual Sponsored Walk: helped Marshall at this fundraiser round the Uni. Networking: attended several meetings & training sessions, working with other Parent Councils locally. School Events: supported various events, providing refreshments, generating more funds to invest back into the school. Active Kids Vouchers: re-established Sainsburys Voucher collection, specifically looking to support the Home Economics department through this scheme. Satellite Events: Linked up with local primary schools in a bid to meet with parents/carers who otherwise may struggle to get along to meetings held at the school. | Chair | WM |
| 7. | Deputy Head Teacher's Report: Junior Awards: Pupils finishing S1 and S2, awards will be made for those who have consistently demonstrated Values / Academic Excellence Colours: Only 'full' colours will be awarded going forward, and will be presented at: Sports Excellence, S3 Graduation, and Senior Awards events. Colours are awarded for 'commitment to school'. Eligible pupils will receive a badge (Junior) or Colours Tie (Seniors). S3 Graduation: introduced this year with good success. | 8. | School Improvement Plan (SIP): This plan is pulled together using both Parental and Pupil feedback (surveys, class feedback), and encompasses whole school performance. This plan will be updated and available via the school website: link. Key focus is around quality assurance, and also on consistency, tracking and monitoring. 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| | Individual Faculty Plan (IFP): the SIP is supplemented by the IFP (for example, Ochil House Plan, Pupil Support Plan, etc) While the SIP is 'statutory' therefore will be published on school website, the IFP is not statutory, however is available on request. The IFP and the SIP both link to the key priorities set out in the National Plan. Pupil Equity Fund (PEF) and Attainment Challenge Fund (ACF): School actively engaged with both means of funding. PEF = funding allocated to schools, targeted at those children most affected by the poverty related attainment gap, ACF = achieving equity in educational outcomes by ensuring every child has the same opportunity to succeed. Parliament have committed this funding for the next 4 years, however it is only guaranteed for 1 year. Allocations will be confirmed at next PTN (31/8) Home Economics: School currently subsidise this faculty by £8,000 per year, which is not sustainable.
