	 Group 4 consists of 7 students from S5/S6 with Mrs Gunn and their classroom is located in Powis 7 which is part of the mainstream

•	M&D Trip: On the 4 th September there will be a trip to M&D's for 19 young		
	people from S1-S4.		
•	Fitness Suite Access: OH young people have access to the Fitness Suite and		
	Weights room this session as part of the Health and Wellbeing Curriculum.		
	The young people will also take part in other mainstream departments		
	including Design and Engineering, Art, Music, Gaelic and PE.		
•	Farm Visits: There are 2 S6 young people and another young person from		
	Ochil House attending the Tiny Farm at St Modan's High School on a weekly		
	basis. They help to manage two raised beds and look after chickens and		
	rabbits. OH Garden Development is hopefully going to begin soon, possibly during

5. • •	 Head Teacher's Report/Update: Bicycle Racks: Extension of the bike rack facilities is scheduled for October. Ochil House Outside Grounds Work: None of the planned outside grounds work was done due to the flooding of Wallace High School at the end of the summer term. FES had to use the time to repair the flood damage. The grounds work will start in the October holiday. PE Room has been converted into an Ochil House classroom. Nextbikes Hub: The bike rental scheme, Nextbikes, has installed a bike hub at the school and students can access free membership. The first hour is free and 50p thereafter. Pupils may cycle to Raploch campus or to other schools if they are attending classes at these sights. Refurbishments: FES (building facilities) has completed the following refurbishments: the library now has a mental health/wellbeing area, study booths and more soft seating; the atrium now has a feature wall, new furniture and some wall moss; the S6 common room now has new furniture, a pool table and table football; the staff bases are being regenerated.
